The City of South San Francisco's Aquatics Division is looking for Part-Time Swim Instructors to teach group and semi-private swim lessons to babies-adults. We offer lessons Monday through Thursday evenings as well as Saturday mornings and afternoons.

Important and Essential Duties

Instructs a variety of swim classes for all ages and ability levels.

Enforces pool rules and regulations.

Assists swimmers in distress and administers First Aid as needed.

Maintains discipline and orderly conduct among patrons.

Maintains good public relations and customer service.

Attend staff meetings and training for the purpose of reviewing teaching techniques, accident procedures, and other material.

Performs related duties as required.

Attend staff meetings and trainings.

Job Related and Essential Qualifications

Knowledge of:

Skills and techniques to conduct swim classes.

Use and care of lifesaving equipment used at public swimming pools.

Use and care of equipment used in swimming instruction.

Ability to:

Follow written and oral instructions.

Perform all swimming strokes according to American Red Cross standards.

Demonstrate lifesaving and emergency first aid skills.

Deal effectively with staff and pool patrons.

Education Experience

Must be 15 years of age or older

Prior aquatic experience is desirable

Licenses, Certificates and Other Requirements

Current Water Safety Instructor, CPR for the Professional Rescuer, and Community First Aid and Safety certifications as issued by the American Red Cross or approved equivalent is desirable. Any offer of employment to an adult employee who will have direct contact with minors is conditional upon submission of a completed fingerprint card and a satisfactory background check.

Special Requirements

Essential duties require the following physical skills and work environment: Lift and carry objects up to 25 pounds; work in typical swimming pool environment; use standard swim instruction equipment; vision to critique swimming skills, hearing and speech to communicate with students.
