NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that the following measure is to be voted on at the Statewide General Municipal Election to be held in the City of South San Francisco on Tuesday, November 05, 2024:

City of South San Francisco Business License Tax Measure

To maintain City services, such as: fire protection/paramedic emergency response; neighborhood police patrols and services; pothole, street and road maintenance; parks and recreation programs; library programs and services; and for general government use; shall the City of South San Francisco ordinance be adopted modernizing the business license tax, with increases in rates varying with the size of the business, as described in the ordinance, providing approximately \$2,600,000 annually, until ended by voters, with annual audits and citizens' oversight? Arguments for or against the above measures may be submitted in writing to the City Clerk's Office, 400 Grand Avenue, South San Francisco, California, for printing and distribution to the voters, pursuant to provisions of the California Elections Code, on or before 5:00 p.m. on August 13, 2024. Rebuttals by authors of said arguments may be filed with the City Clerk's Office in like manner on or before 5:00 p.m. on August 20, 2024.

No argument shall exceed 300 words and no rebuttal shall exceed 250 words in length. No more than five signatures shall appear with any argument.

A ballot argument or a rebuttal argument which includes in its text the name of a person, other than the author(s) of the argument, who is represented as being for or against the measure, shall not be accepted unless the argument is accompanied by a signed consent of such person(s).

One argument for, and one rebuttal thereto, if any, on the measure will be selected for printing and distribution to the voters. If more than one argument for or more than one argument against any city measure is submitted to the City Clerk within the time prescribed, the City Clerk shall select one of the arguments in favor and one of the arguments against the measure for printing and distribution to the

voters. In selecting the argument, the City Clerk shall give preference and priority in the order named to the arguments of the following:

1. The legislative body of the City, or member or members of the legislative body authorized by the body.
2. The individual voter, or bona fide association of citizens, or combination of voters and associations, who are the bona fide sponsors or proponents of the measure.
3. Bona fide associations of citizens.
4. Individual voters who are eligible to vote on the measure.
