CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS IN SSF

201 -219 GRAND AVENUE (ROEM Developments)

There are daily material deliveries scheduled, and additional truck traffic is expected. The contractor will maintain access to Cypress Avenue between 3rd Lane and Grand Avenue. The traffic flaggers will assist the truck driver's delivery of materials. Commuters can expect a 3–5-minute delay as materials are offloaded and safely brought onto the site. The sidewalk along Cypress Avenue and Grand Avenue directly in front of the project are closed, and detour signs have been posted.



428 BADEN AVENUE

The sidewalk along the project's Baden Avenue frontage is closed, allowing grading and foundation work to proceed. The sidewalk will be reopened in a subsequent phase of work. Pedestrian detour signage is deployed, noting a safe path of travel around the work area. Additionally, the project expects daily material deliveries, and additional truck traffic is expected. The contractor will maintain vehicular access to Baden Avenue and 3rd Lane. Drivers can expect minor delays. Construction flaggers will be deployed during material

deliveries. Please always follow the signs and safety personnel instructions.

CIVIC CAMPUS: LIBRARY, PARKS & RECREATION AND COMMUNITY THEATER/COUNCIL CHAMBERS (1010 El Camino Real)

Daily material deliveries are scheduled, adding additional truck traffic along Antoinette Lane and Chestnut Avenue between 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

The Civic Campus Way sidewalk along the project frontage is closed. Pedestrians are encouraged to use the sidewalk across the street in front of the new Police Operations & 911 Dispatch Center. Detour signs are posted to guide pedestrians to a safe path of travel.

Civic Campus Way, north of Chestnut Avenue, is tentatively scheduled to be repaved in July. Notice will be delivered to impacted residents/nearby businesses before work commences. The work will reduce street parking and travel effects to a single lane managed by traffic flaggers. Access to residential complexes will be maintained; however, momentary delays can be expected.

Fire water line installation continues impacting Chestnut Avenue at El Camino Real and Civic Campus Way up to the end of the cul-de-sac. Work will reduce westbound Chestnut Avenue to a single lane between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. daily between Mission Boulevard and El Camino Real. Civic Campus Way will be reduced to a single lane managed by traffic flaggers to maintain two-way travel. Sidewalks will remain open throughout the construction process.

Sidewalk work along El Camino Real between Chestnut Avenue and Arroyo Drive continues through July. The job entails the replacement of the sidewalk, and as a result, this will not be available for use. Detour signage will be deployed, noting the safe path of travel around the impacted section. Minor impacts are expected to northbound El Camino Real between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. as the shoulder/merge construction crews will take over a lane. Please always follow the signs and safety personnel instructions.



Smart Corridors Expansion Project

The Smart Corridor Expansion project is a joint effort by the City and Caltrans to develop a traffic management system along key arterial corridors that parallel US-101 and I-380. The Smart Corridor program provides public agencies the tools to safely manage traffic congestion through local streets during normal operating conditions, major freeway incidents, and special events.

The project stretches along the following:

1. Airport Blvd: US-101 (City limit) to Terminal Ct.
2. South Airport Blvd: Road 21 to Mitchell Ave.
3. Gateway Blvd: Mitchell Ave to Oyster Point Blvd.

Work will proceed daily (Monday through Friday). Some work will be performed at night to alleviate possible congestion resulting from this work. Upcoming daytime traffic impact between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. areas include:

1. Northbound Airport Blvd at North Access Road.
2. Southbound S. Airport Blvd at San Bruno Ave at the turn pocket.
3. Northbound Airport Blvd and Wondercolor Avenue impacting the second lane.
4. S. Airport Blvd and Road 21 intersection impacting lane #2.
5. Gateway Blvd & Genentech Driveway
6. Gateway Blvd and Grand Ave Area
7. Belle Air Road and S. Airport Blvd impacting lane #2.

Commuters can expect delays and are encouraged to use alternate routes.

30 Tanforan Avenue – Southline Development

Utility undergrounding work is underway, impacting multiple streets and serving as a frontage to the project. The work is being phased to minimize vehicle and pedestrian travel disruptions. The work will proceed as follows:

- **S. Maple Avenue** between Tanforan Avenue and Browning Way: The work will reduce S. Maple Avenue to a single lane and will be managed by traffic flaggers to maintain two-way travel. No parking signs will be deployed on the impacted section. The work is proceeding after 9:00 a.m. daily.
- **Tanforan Avenue** between S. Maple Avenue and San Mateo Avenue: The work will reduce Tanforan Avenue to a single lane and will be managed by traffic flaggers to maintain two-way travel. No parking signs will be deployed on the impacted section. The work is proceeding after 9:00 a.m. daily.

Commuters can expect delays and are encouraged to use alternate routes. Construction flaggers will be deployed to help maintain vehicular travel. Please always follow the signs and safety personnel instructions.

Grand Avenue & Airport Boulevard Streetscape Improvement

Streetscape improvement work at the intersection of Grand Avenue and Airport Boulevard continues. The work will improve all four corners of the intersection, including the medians. The work is being phased to minimize impacts, but due to the nature of the work, traffic control measures will remain up 24/7, with work proceeding daily, Monday through Friday, between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.

The current work is scheduled on the southeast corner (across the way from gas station side/Caltrain station side) and northwest corner (corner next to Peet's Coffee). The work will result in single-lane closures impacting northbound and southbound travel along Airport Boulevard and eastbound travel at Grand Avenue. Delays are expected.

Commuters are encouraged to use alternate routes. Construction flaggers will be deployed to help maintain vehicular travel when necessary. Pedestrian detour signage will be deployed, routing pedestrians around the work zones. Pedestrian access to Caltrain Station is maintained. Please always follow the signs and safety personnel instructions.

475 Eccles Avenue (Gateway of Pacific 5)

Offsite work is scheduled along the project's frontage through October 2023,

resulting in street parking impacts and a lane shift. The work will proceed between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. daily. Travel through Eccles Avenue will be maintained, but commuters are encouraged to use alternate routes as there may be momentary delays. Construction flaggers will be deployed to help maintain vehicular travel when necessary. The sidewalk directly in front of the project will be closed. Pedestrian detour signage will be deployed, routing pedestrians around work zones. Please always follow the signs and safety personnel instructions.

PG&E Substation (Gateway Blvd between E. Grand Avenue and Oyster Point Blvd)

New infrastructure is being installed along Gateway Boulevard between E. Grand Avenue and Oyster Point Boulevard. Work will result in a 24/7 lane closure on northbound Gateway Boulevard. Work is being phased to minimize impacts to travel. The work will proceed between 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. daily. Travel through Gateway Boulevard will be maintained, but commuters are encouraged to use alternate routes as there may be momentary delays. Construction flaggers will be deployed to help keep vehicular travel when necessary. The sidewalks will remain open as work is underway. Please always follow the signs and safety personnel instructions.

750 Gateway Boulevard

Contractor has scheduled work that necessitates the closure of northbound Gateway Boulevard approximately 600-feet south of Oyster Point Boulevard (projects frontage) as a large mobile crane needs to be utilized. Work is scheduled to be performed over a weekend to minimize impacts to this area. Work will proceed under two mobilizations the first one occurring the weekend of June 17 (Saturday) and 18 (Sunday) and the next one being in July. Detour signage will be deployed routing commuters around closed portion of Gateway Boulevard. Delays are expected and commuters are encouraged to use alternate routes. Please always follow the signs and safety personnel instructions.



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
