CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS IN SSF

428 BADEN AVENUE

Contractor to begin trenching a new gas line on Baden Ave on Monday

February 26th. Work will continue for four working days and result in one lane closure. The sidewalk along the project's Baden Avenue frontage is closed. The sidewalk will be reopened in a subsequent phase of work. Pedestrian detour signage is deployed, noting a safe path of travel around the work area. Additionally, the project expects daily material deliveries, and additional truck traffic is expected. The contractor will maintain vehicular access to Baden Avenue and 3rd Lane. Drivers can expect minor delays. Construction flaggers will be deployed during material deliveries. Please always follow the signs and safety personnel instructions.



El CAMINO REAL (Between Arroyo Dr. and Kaiser Way)

Improvements continue along El Camino Real between Arroyo Drive and Kaiser Way as part of the Grand Boulevard project which includes improvements to sidewalks, planting, roadway, lighting, and landscaping. Work is currently focused along the southbound side of El Camino Real and Del Paso Drive. Minor lane shifts will be deployed as work is underway along El Camino Real (weather dependent). Pedestrian detour signage when required will be deployed, noting a safe path of travel around the work area. Drivers can expect minor delays. Please always follow the signs and safety personnel instructions.



GRAND AVENUE & AIRPORT BOULEVARD STREETSCAPE IMPROVEMENT

Streetscape improvement work at the intersection of Grand Avenue and Airport Boulevard continues. The work will improve all four corners of the intersection, including the medians. The work is being phased to minimize impacts. The Contractor has scheduled the execution of the traffic signal switchover for Tuesday, February 27th and Wednesday, February 28th. This process will involve removing the existing traffic signals and their foundations, as well as energizing and programming the new traffic signals. Due to safety concerns, this work will need to be conducted during the day, and delays are anticipated.

Commuters are encouraged to use alternate routes during these days. Construction flaggers will be present to assist with vehicular travel as needed. Pedestrian detour signage will be in place to guide pedestrians around the work zones. Access for pedestrians to the Caltrain Station will be maintained. Please adhere to signs and follow instructions from safety personnel for your safety and that of others.

Paving activities along Airport Blvd between Miller Ave and Baden Ave are scheduled to resume once weather conditions improve.



PG&E SUBSTATION (Gateway Blvd between E. Grand Ave and Oyster Point Blvd)

Work continues along Gateway Boulevard between E. Grand Avenue and Oyster Point Boulevard. Work will result in lane closure on northbound Gateway Boulevard and eastbound Oyster Point Boulevard. The work will proceed over the weekend to minimize disruptions on:

- 1. Saturday, February 24
- 2. Sunday, March 3

Travel through Gateway Boulevard and Oyster Point Blvd. will be maintained,

but commuters are encouraged to use alternate routes as there may be momentary delays. Construction flaggers will be deployed to help keep vehicular travel when necessary. The sidewalks will remain open as work is underway.

As part of this work, PG&E will be coordinating with impacted businesses/customers as there is an expected power outage. Businesses/customers impacted will receive a notice directly from PG&E if they fall on the impact zone. Power outage is expected on Sunday, March 9 and Sunday, March 16.



SMART CORRIDORS EXPANSION PROJECT

The Smart Corridor Expansion project is a joint effort by the City and Caltrans to develop a traffic management system along key arterial corridors that parallel US-101 and I-380. The Smart Corridor program provides public agencies the tools to safely manage traffic congestion through local streets during normal operating conditions, major freeway incidents, and special events.

The project stretches along the following:

- 1. Airport Blvd: US-101 (City limit) to Terminal Ct.
- 2. South Airport Blvd: Road 21 to Mitchell Ave.
- 3. Gateway Blvd: Mitchell Ave to Oyster Point Blvd.

Work will proceed daily (Monday through Friday). Some work will be performed at night to alleviate possible congestion resulting from this work.

February 26 to March 1, 2024 (Typical work hours 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.)

- Southbound Produce Avenue between Terminal Ct and Mitchell Ave
- South Airport at Wondercolor
- S. Airport between 101 Off Ramp and San Bruno
- Northbound and Southbound Gateway Blvd. between E. Grand Ave and Mitchell Ave.
- Linden Ave, Canal to Baden
- Southbound and Northbound Airport, Sister Cities to Grand

Commuters can expect delays and are encouraged to use alternate routes.



CENTENNIAL TRAIL PARK SOUTH

The Centennial Trail Improvements project continues. The Centennial Trail Improvements project mobilized Monday January 29. Access to the project is from South Spruce Avenue using the maintenance driveway. Construction traffic will be temporarily directed into the construction area from South Spruce Avenue using Centennial Trail. Trail users may be impacted. Flaggers will be available to direct trail users and construction traffic during the temporary construction vehicle detour.

Work hours are Monday through Friday 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. For additional

OYSTER POINT IIC IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Construction has begun Oyster Point Marina/Park. The entire section of East Basin Rd at Marina Blvd is closed during the duration of the project. The East portion of the Bay Trail will be detoured for the duration of the project, while the West portion will remain open except for a short periodic disruption. Pedestrian detour signage has been deployed, routing pedestrian around the open portions of the Bay Trail.

Parking lot is closed at the lower parking lot near the windsurf ramp and picnic area. The parking lot for trailers will be impacted by losing around 10 stalls for staging area but will remain open to the public.

The Oyster Point boat launch, fishing pier, public bathrooms and Dominic's at Oyster Point will remain open during constructions. The Windsurf launch ramp will remain closed during construction.

30 TANFORAN AVENUE - SOUTHLINE DEVELOPMENT

Utility work continues impacting multiple streets and serving as a frontage to the project. The work is being phased to minimize vehicle and pedestrian travel disruptions. The work will proceed as follows:

• South Linden Avenue between Victory Avenue and Dollar Avenue parking will be restricted during working hours to allow temporary lane shifts to occur as work is underway between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. Lane shifts will impact both the northbound and southbound travel on S. Linden Avenue.

- **Dollar Avenue** between Tanforan Avenue and S. Linden Avenue parking will be restricted during working hours to allow temporary lane shifts to occur between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Lane shifts will impact both the northbound and southbound travel on Dollar Ave.
- Tanforan Ave between Dollar Avenue and S. Maple Avenue parking will be restricted during working hours to allow temporary lane shifts to occur between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Lane shifts will impact both the northbound and southbound travel on Dollar Ave. Additionally, work within the site will be proceeding under extended hours to 11:00 p.m. through Friday, March 8.
- South Maple Ave between Browning Way to Tanforan Avenue will be closed. South Maple Ave will have NO access for traffic vehicles except for emergency vehicles. A portion of Centennial Way Trail will also be closed, pedestrian traffic will be rerouted to the sidewalk on the east side of South Maple Avenue. The closure will remain for the whole duration of work.

Commuters can expect delays and are encouraged to use alternate routes. Construction flaggers will be deployed to help maintain vehicular travel. Please always follow the signs and safety personnel instructions.



2023 STREET SURFACE PROJECT

City continues work on its 2023 Street Improvement Project along various streets west of US-101 (see map below). Work will be phased to minimize impacts from construction. Work will proceed daily between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

Work to repair failed concrete, curb, gutter and valley gutter sections is

complete.

Repair of failed street sections (Base Repairs) will occur during the upcoming two weeks in the following locations:

February 26 through March 1:

- Almond Ave from Orange Ave top Eucalyptus
- First Lane from Spruce Ave to Linden Ave
- Second Lane from Spruce Ave to Linden Ave
- Third Lane from Chestnut Ave to Eucalyptus Ave
- Fourth Lane from Cypress Ave to Maple Ave
- Locust Ave from Tamarak Ln to Grand Ave
- Orange Ave from Railroad Ave to Grand Ave
- Eucalyptus Ave from Grand Ave to Park Way
- Grand Ave from Spruce Ave to Orange Ave
- Grand Ave from Spruce Ave to Airport Blvd. (NIGHT WORK Anticipated to be done in early March possibly 3/3/24 to 3/7/24)

Notice will be posted along impacted areas 72-hours in advance of impact. Local access will be maintained throughout most phases of work. Delays are expected and commuters are encouraged to use alternate routes. Please always follow the signs and safety personnel instructions.
