



I hope you and your loved ones fared well through the last two days of storm events. Recognizing the stressful issues of this past week, I thought it important to share a recap with you of how we fared, but also share with you upcoming events to bring a sense of normalcy. While certainly continuing our storm response, we recognize that the Mayor Update is a resource for all community members that find it valuable.

With a slight break in the weather, now is the time to prepare for the next wave of storms.

- The latest National Weather Service (NWS) update is that precipitation
 will be light/scattered from now through Saturday/Sunday; however, two
 storm systems are anticipated next week beginning on Monday; the
 NWS will issue a more accurate forecast on Sunday at which time the
 City will evaluate the potential impacts;
- Sand and bags are being replenished at Maintenance Services Building; supplies remain available to the public; just a reminder, only ten bags per household;
- The Temporary Evacuation Point/Charging Facility at the Fernekes Building is now closed but may reopen next week based on need;
- Slide and debris flow mitigation work completed after last weekend's storm on Sign Hill held very well, with little to no noticeable additional soil movement;
- Only a handful of city trees were downed to date, thanks to preventative maintenance efforts before the storm; however, several private trees fell; and
- Over the two operational periods, Fire responded to almost 20 stormspecific calls related to trees down, wires down, and flooding.

BAY AREA STORM UPDATE

- **Storm Conditions**. The City is monitoring the next storm, with more rain forecasted for the weekend and continuing intermittently through next week. Find regular storm updates at www.ssf.net.
- Gain Real-Time Updates on Storm Impacts and Potential Emergency Alerts and Warnings. Get real-time notifications from the City via email, Twitter, Facebook, and NextDoor. Receive emergency alerts via SMCAlert.
- Evacuations are always possible. If you're ordered to evacuate, leave quickly. Here's what to pack in an emergency kit. (Water, food and a flashlight are must-haves.) Download a printable version to take with you to the store. Once you look at the basic items, consider what unique needs your family might have, such as supplies for pets or seniors.
- SMC Alert San Mateo County's Alert System. The San Mateo County alert and warning system is undergoing a major upgrade. The web address for SMC Alert will remain SMCAlert. info but the software will be changing from Everbridge to RAVE mobile alerting. If you are already enrolled in SMC Alert your information has been transferred to the new system, you will continue to receive alerts as you have in the past. We encourage you to create a new account on the new SMC Alert so that you can access new innovative features and make any changes to your account. Creating a new account will not cause you to receive doubled up messages. Messages from the new SMC Alert text messages may come from any of the following short code mobile phone numbers: 226787, 67283, 78015, 81837, or 77295. E-mail notifications will come from smcalert@smcgov.org
