- REMINDER! COVID-19 Test-to-Treat Sites Closing February 5, 2023
 The state announced that most of the LHI/OptumServe COVID-19 Test-to-Treat sites in San Mateo County will be closing by Sunday, Feb 5, 2023, due to December utilization rates below 50%. Below are the affected locations in South San Francisco.
 - Orange Memorial Park, 781 Tennis Drive
 - Mater Dolorosa Church, 307 Willow Avenue

- Half Moon Bay Victims Fund. There is no way to describe the overwhelming loss of life that took place in Monterey Park and Half Moon Bay, and the toll these tragedies have taken on the Asian American, Latinx, and farm worker communities in California and across the nation. If you are looking for ways to get involved, STOP AAPI HATE, and their co-founding partner, Chinese for Affirmative Action, have started the Half Moon Bay Victims' Fund, which will put resources in the hands of those affected by recent incidents of gun violence. 100% of donations will go to the victims and families of Half Moon Bay and the community-based organizations providing direct services.

 Disaster Assistance. The deadline for homeowners and renters to apply
 is March 16, 2023. Homeowners and renters in San Mateo County with
 damage or losses due to the series of New Year's storms can apply for
 federal disaster assistance. Disaster assistance may include grants to
 help pay for temporary housing and essential home repairs and other
 serious disaster-related needs such as medical and dental expenses,
 transportation, childcare and moving and storage expenses. The deadline

- FREE Caltrain Go Passes. Commute.org and Caltrain have partnered to provide a new Caltrain Go Pass to San Mateo County residents. The Go Pass provides free train trips on Caltrain between zones at any time! To be eligible, you must make less than \$70,000/year, work or live in San Mateo County, and plan on using the card at least twice a week. Go Passes will be valid until 12/31/23 with limited supply. worries. The San Mateo County Mosquito & Vector Control District can check for mosquitoes breeding in the water and keep them from growing. With the rains, there may be houses that might have flooding in their crawlspaces - the cool weather right now is keeping the mosquito life cycle slow. However, if the water continues to stand under houses until it warms up, there may be many mosquitoes! Detecting water now is key to helping everyone have a mosquito-free summer.
