



Happy Rainy Friday! The rain is back, and we are enduring another winter storm that's expected to bring heavy rain and high winds that could cause flooding, mudslides, and falling trees through the weekend. The National Weather Service forecasted gusty winds, thunderstorms, and heavy rain starting late last night and into today, with a flood watch continuing through the weekend. Staff is monitoring catch basins/storm drains and additional equipment and extra staff are on standby through Sunday to respond to the storm, if necessary. Please take precautions now for potential flooding and possible power outages due to

storm impacts and sign up for emergency alerts here. Just a reminder: Please only call 9-1-1 for emergencies. Lastly, for your and your family's safety, know your zone. Emergency managers have carved the Peninsula into more than 300 zones on an online, publicly available map supported by Zonehaven, a California-based company under contract with the County of San Mateo. Each zone is assigned a short code. All residents can enter an address to find your zone. In an emergency, first responders will issue evacuation or other orders and advisories based on the zones. This information will be pushed out via the news media, social media such as Twitter, emergency alert notifications, and other platforms.

Household Hazardous Waste Event in South San Francisco. The Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Program is hosting a drop-off event in South San Francisco on Saturday, April 1, 2023, 9:00 am-12:00 pm. Accepted items include cleaning products; fertilizers and garden chemicals; pesticides, herbicides, and rodenticides; solvents; flammable liquids; fluorescent lights (compact and tubes), paint thinner, acids/bases, aerosol cans, and automotive supplies (car batteries, motor oil, oil filters, antifreeze, brake fluid). All waste collected is reused, recycled, or stabilized for proper disposal to achieve zero waste and prevent any items from going to the landfill and contaminating our water and soil. No electronic, radioactive, explosive, or medical waste is accepted. This event is open to all who live in San Mateo County. To participate, you must schedule an appointment at San Mateo County's HHW Program: smchealth.org/hhw-appt or by calling (650) 372-6200. The event location is disclosed once your appointment is confirmed. Limit 10 gallons or 50 pounds per appointment (per carload). If you have greater than 10 gallons, you must schedule additional appointments for every 10 gallons and make separate vehicle trips for each appointment. No commercial waste is allowed. Residents unable to attend this event can still dispose of household hazardous waste for free at San Mateo County's permanent HHW facility Thursdays-Saturdays (except major holiday weekends). You must make an appointment at smchealth.org/hhw-appt or call (650) 372-6200. Recycling/safe disposal of paint, fluorescent lights, household batteries, and used motor oil/filters can be done at a local collection center – no appointment is needed. COUNTY UPDATES

- The deadline to Apply for Federal Disaster Assistance is March 16. The
 Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and Small Business
 Administration offer relief grants, loans, and other assistance for damage
 caused by the storms and flooding that began in late December 2022.
 The deadline to apply is March 16, 2023. Disaster assistance may include
 grants to help pay for temporary housing, home repairs, medical
 expenses, childcare, and moving & storage expenses. Specialists are
 available to assist with the application process at the San Mateo County
 Event Center through March 14, online or by calling 800-621-3362. Read

- County Needs Help to Secure Broadband Funding. The County of San Mateo is asking residents, particularly those without access to Broadband Internet, to take a survey from the Federal Communications Commission that could help secure funding to bring high-speed Internet access to local underserved and unserved communities. The FCC requires Internet service providers to report where they make Internet services available. The FCC reviews the data and then publishes it on the National Broadband Map. Residents can dispute, or challenge, information shown on the map that they believe is inaccurate. Read more here.

- Caltrain Temporarily Reduces Weekend Service to Expedite Electrification Construction. On March 11-12, Caltrain will be suspending rail service between San Francisco and Millbrae Stations to accommodate Caltrain Electrification construction and testing. Caltrain encourages riders to see how this change in service will affect their commute and to seek alternative transit options if they would better suit their transportation needs. Limited bus service, known as a bus bridge, will be provided to Caltrain-dependent riders traveling to or from the affected area. These will be the first of 31 weekends in 2023 in which service will be adjusted to accommodate construction and testing for electrified service, which is expected to launch passenger service in fall 2024. On February 18-19, Caltrain will operate on its regular weekend schedule. Read more here.
- The San Mateo County Transit District (District) Board of Directors is seeking applicants to fill one public member seat. The successful candidate will be one of nine directors responsible for setting policy for the district, which is responsible for the countywide SamTrans bus and paratransit services. Public members who apply must be San Mateo County residents living outside of the County's coastal region and must not have held public office for at least one year. Each appointment has a four-year term. The board consists of nine members: three members appointed by the Board of Supervisors, three members who are appointed by the City Selection Committee, who are council members representing the northern, central, and southern portions of the county; and three public members, one of whom is a coast side resident. Regular meetings are scheduled for the first Wednesday of each month at 2:00 p.m. The deadline for applying is 5:00 p.m. Thursday, March 30. The application is available at www.samtrans.com/boardofdirectors or by calling 650-5086242.
- Peninsula Humane Society & SPCA's Pet Food Bank. Striving to keep pets
 and their families together, Peninsula Humane Society & SPCA created a
 Pet Food Bank to assist pet owners with food and other supplies for their
 pets. Low-income county residents or those suffering financial hardship
 can register to receive pet food and litter from the food bank. Income
 verification is not necessary, but advance registration for the Pet Food
 Bank is required. The Pet Food Bank occurs on the second Friday of each
 month and is 100% donor funded. To receive pet food, applicants must:
- Be a resident of San Mateo County and experiencing financial hardship.
- Agree to use the food bank for personal companion animals in need.
- Understand that food is donated to Peninsula Humane Society & SPCA and the same brand or type of pet food cannot be guaranteed each month.
- Enroll no more than four pets per household.
