Typical grant awards will range from \$500-\$2,000 and will require your organization to enter into a funding agreement with the City. - Household Hazardous Waste Event in South San Francisco. The Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Program is hosting a drop-off event in South San Francisco on Saturday, April 1, 2023, 9:00 am-12:00 pm. Accepted items include cleaning products; fertilizers and garden chemicals; pesticides, herbicides, and rodenticides; solvents; flammable liquids; fluorescent lights (compact and tubes); paint thinner, acids/bases, aerosol cans, and automotive supplies (car batteries, motor oil, oil filters, antifreeze, brake fluid). All waste collected is reused, recycled, or stabilized for proper disposal to achieve zero waste and prevent any items from going to the landfill and contaminating our water and soil. No electronic, radioactive, explosive, or medical waste is accepted. This event is open to all who live in San Mateo County. To participate, you must schedule an appointment at San Mateo County's HHW Program: smchealth.org/hhw-appt or by calling (650) 372-6200. The event location is disclosed once your appointment is confirmed. Limit 10 gallons or 50 pounds per appointment (per carload). If you have greater than 10 gallons, you must schedule additional appointments for every 10 gallons and make separate vehicle trips for each appointment. No commercial waste is allowed. Residents unable to attend this event

can still dispose of household hazardous waste for free at San Mateo County's permanent HHW facility Thursdays-Saturdays (except major holiday weekends). You must make an appointment at <a href="mailto:smchealth.org/hhw-appt">smchealth.org/hhw-appt</a> or call (650) 372-6200. Recycling/safe disposal of paint, fluorescent lights, household batteries, and used motor oil/filters can be done at a local collection center — no appointment is needed. #### **COUNTY UPDATES**

- SMC County Needs Help to Secure Broadband Funding. The County of
  San Mateo is asking residents, particularly those without access to
  Broadband Internet, to take a survey from the Federal Communications
  Commission that could help secure funding to bring high-speed Internet
  access to local underserved and unserved communities. The FCC requires
  Internet service providers to report where they make Internet services
  available. The FCC reviews the data and publishes it on the National
  Broadband Map. Residents can dispute or challenge information shown
  on the map that they believe is inaccurate. Read more here.
- The San Mateo County Transit District (District) Board of Directors is seeking applicants to fill one public member seat. The successful candidate will be one of nine directors responsible for setting policy for the district, which is responsible for the countywide SamTrans bus and paratransit services. Public members who apply must be San Mateo County residents living outside of the County's coastal region and must not have held public office for at least one year. Each appointment has a four-year term. The board consists of nine members: three members appointed by the Board of Supervisors, three members who are appointed by the City Selection Committee, who are council members representing the northern, central, and southern portions of the county; and three public members, one of whom is a coast side resident. Regular meetings are scheduled for the first Wednesday of each month at 2 p.m. The deadline for applying is 5 p.m. Thursday, March 30.
