- AAPI Community Conversations | Friday, May 12, 5:30 p.m. 7:00 p.m. In honor of Asian-American & Pacific Islander (AAPI) Month, join us for a *Community Conversation* event hosted by South San Francisco Mayor Flor Nicolas. The event will be held at the Municipal Services Building, 33 Arroyo Dr., Council Chambers. Hear from local AAPI leaders their stories of resilience, inspiration, and celebration of their AAPI heritage. - Sign-up for a FREE Hepatitis B Screening on Friday, May 19, and Friday, May 26. Did you know that one in 12 adult Asian immigrants have Hepatitis B? And those who have this disease are 100 times more likely to develop liver cancer. Those with Hepatitis B could experience no symptoms, in fact, two in three Asians with Hepatitis B don't know they are infected. Because testing is the only way to know if someone has been infected with Hepatitis B, the City of South San Francisco is partnering with San Francisco Hep B Free Bay Area to provide FREE Hepatitis B Screenings. Residents may learn more about Hepatitis B and sign up for a FREE screening on Friday, May 19, and Friday, May 26 at the Breezeway of the Economic Advancement Center (366 Grand Ave) from 9:00 a.m. 1:00 p.m.
- Military Equipment Community Meeting. On May 22, 2023, the South San Francisco Police Department is hosting a community engagement meeting regarding the funding, acquisition, and use of items designated as military equipment pursuant to Assembly Bill 481. The meeting will include a short presentation about Assembly Bill 481, a summary of our equipment, followed by an opportunity for you to ask questions and speak with staff from the police department. Our military equipment policy was introduced during a regular City Council meeting on June 22, 2022, and was adopted by the City Council on July 27, 2022. - Gun Buyback Results. A total of 264 firearms were collected during a
 gun buyback Saturday, May 6, 2023, held in South San Francisco. This
 total included nine assault weapons (as defined by the state of California)
 and four "ghost" guns, which are untraceable. The event was hosted by
 the San Mateo County Sheriff's Office, South San Francisco Police
 Department, San Bruno Police Department, Daly City Police Department,
 Colma Police Department, and the Citizens for San Mateo County Gun
 Buyback. A gun buyback for southern San Mateo County is being
 planned.
- San Mateo County Parks in partnership with the San Mateo County Human Services Agency presents the Mariposa Program. - Retailers That Sell Tobacco to Kids Face Stiffer Penalties The San Mateo County Board of Supervisors today voted unanimously to increase penalties on businesses that sell cigarettes and other tobacco products to minors. Proposed by County Health, the increased penalties are intended to discourage retailers from taking the risk of selling tobacco products to minors and help prevent youth from getting hooked on nicotine. In California, 67 percent of current and former smokers report that they started smoking by the age of 18. Read more here.
