



School's out for summer! While many of us are excited for all the fun summer activities with our children and grandchildren, some families approach summer with worry over how they will provide their child with nutritious meals every day. Food insecurity is real and affects 1 in 5 or 8.4 million Californians.

Food insecurity is defined by the USDA as a lack of consistent access to enough food for every person in a household to live an active, healthy life. The negative impact that Covid-19 had on the economic well-being of

many residents intensified this problem in our community. The very high response to the food distribution programs that were established to address food insecurity exposed the level of need here in South San Francisco. While the economy continues to recover from Covid-19, many of our residents have not recovered financially, and we know that there is still a high need for food. We also know that with schools closed for the summer, many children who rely on the Free Lunch program will not have access to this meal.

There are several free non-profit and church-sponsored food distribution programs in South San Francisco, operating at different locations and on different days of the week. The best and most reliable, up-to-date food bank opportunities are listed at the Second Harvest website locator: https://www.shfb.org/get-food/. The convenient thing about using the food locator website is when you select a location, not only will it show you the day, time, and frequency of the distribution, it will also provide helpful information such as documents required for registration, items to bring to carry the food, the amount of food residents will receive, and much more information. This is a great and easy way to identify food sites within the City.

Let's work together to share this information with families who may be in need of assistance this summer. As always, if you know of a friend or neighbor who does not receive these important City updates, please forward this email to them, and they can <u>sign up here</u>.

CITY UPDATES

- Main Library to Close on July 7. South San Francisco's Main Library on West Orange Avenue will close on Friday, July 7, at 6:00 PM, in preparation for its move to a new, modern building at El Camino Real and Chestnut Avenue. The library will be moving to the new, state-ofthe-art Library and Parks & Recreation Center on the corner of El Camino Real and Chestnut Avenue, across the street from the new Police Station. Due to the nature of the construction process, an exact opening day for the new facility has yet to be determined. It is the City's goal to open the Library and Parks & Recreation Center in Fall 2023. As we get closer to a clear opening date, we will share that information with the community. The new Library and Parks & Recreation Center will be the home for many of the City's most popular programs and events. The Library will feature several new amenities for the community including a high-tech Discovery Center, Teen Zone, and study and meeting rooms, alongside Parks & Recreation's fitness and dance studios, classrooms, teaching kitchen, and large banquet and event spaces. The Center also features a 1.3 acre park and playground. For more information about the project, visit <u>www.communityciviccampus.net</u>
- Westborough Park Pathway Project. The Westborough Park Pathway Rehabilitation Project is nearing completion. All paving is completed and the last item awaiting completion is the installation of handrails. The rails are fabricated and currently going through the galvanization process which will take at least one week. Staff anticipate the construction fencing being removed and the park opening by June 9. The scope of work for the project included the repair of all asphalt pathways, staircases, and the addition of handrails at all staircases within the upper park area. In the interim, staff will be working to restore the field and baseball diamond since it has been closed for the project.
- Citywide Weed Abatement. Parks staff have begun the citywide effort to perform weed abatement prior to the warmer dry months. Medians, right-of-way areas, and other areas susceptible to wildfires are prioritized for abatement.
