



Happy Juneteenth Day! Juneteenth was first celebrated in 1866, however, it was not until 2021 that it was officially designated as a federal holiday by President Biden. Although President Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation on January 1, 1863, it was not until two years later that the last enslaved people in Texas learned of their proclaimed freedom. Those enslaved people learned of their freedom on June 19, 1866, when Union General Gordon Grander issued General Order Number 3. This date is celebrated throughout the country as a time for awareness, reflection, and remembrance. As a city, we

join together in solidarity in the name of freedom, justice, and community.

I would also like to update you on the Safeway site at 180 El Camino Real. The developers are committed to meeting their obligation of construction on the site by next summer, but softening lending markets are slowing nearly all development nationwide. Despite this, developers remain committed to delivering this project to our community and anticipates delivering the project within 18 months from of the start of construction.
