Note that free transportation is here and expanding in South San Francisco! If you don't already know about the South City Shuttle, this program currently provides free transportation to various destinations throughout the Sunshine Gardens, Paradise Valley, Downtown, Orange Park neighborhoods, and El Camino Real corridor including city parks, buildings, downtown shops, schools, libraries, senior centers, as well as transportation connections to BART, SamTrans and Caltrain.

In response to the high demand for this program not only to continue, but also expand its service to additional neighborhoods, I am proud to announce that the South City Shuttle will do just that! Neighborhoods such as Winston Manor, Serra Highlands, Buri Buri, Avalon, and Westborough will receive shuttle service providing riders with access to even more city parks, buildings, schools, and connections to the current shuttle routes and other transit options. The addition of this new route, as well as minor modifications to the current clockwise and counter clockwise routes will go into effect starting August 2023 and continue its service schedule of Monday through Friday.

This effort to continue and expand the South City Shuttle program is made possible in part from San Mateo County and Local Measure A funding to help reduce traffic congestion, make regional connections, enhance safety, and meet local mobility needs. A huge thanks to my colleague, Vice Mayor Mark Nagales, for his leadership on the San Mateo County Transportation Authority, as well as Public Works staffer Marissa Garren for successfully applying for grant funding and administering this program.
