# NATIONAL NIGHT OUT – Tuesday, August 1

Started by a volunteer in Philadelphia in 1984, National Night Out events have been held for the past 39 years in 17,000 communities, activating 38 million neighbors. Over four-hundred cities in California will participate this year, including South San Francisco. It is an annual community-building campaign that promotes neighborhood camaraderie to make neighborhoods safer, more caring places to live. The County of San Mateo is hosting a series of listening sessions and survey to hear directly from residents about their needs in four key areas.
