A huge thanks to my Council colleague, Vice Mayor Nagales, for his current work on the San Mateo County Transportation Authority (SMCTA) Board and to former Mayor and Councilmember

Karyl Matsumoto, for her vision and advocacy in the creation of the South City Shuttle Program. The shuttle program is supported by the SMCTA's Shuttle Program. - Discounts of \$30 or \$75 per month on their internet bills; and
- \$100 discount to purchase a laptop, desktop computer or tablet.
