With Halloween now behind us, please remember some eco-friendly tips when disposing your pumpkins and unwanted candy. Pumpkins can be placed in your green bin for your weekly scheduled yard waste collection day. Alternatively, you can introduce your carved pumpkin to a backyard composter, allowing you to make your very own compost right at home! For accelerated decomposition, consider chopping the pumpkin into smaller pieces. Please remember that painted pumpkins and those with melted candles are considered contaminated, therefore are non-compostable and must be disposed of in your gray trash bin. For all unwanted candy, it's crucial to unwrap it before placing it in your green bin as the wrappers are non-recyclable and considered trash as well. By diverting food waste from our landfills, we, South San Franciscans actively combat climate change!

The Homestead Act of 1862 had far reaching impacts on the United States including western expansion, immigration, and technological innovation. The impacts of the Act also extended to those Native Americans who already called the West home. The American bison or "buffalo" was sacred to many Native American tribes. The animals played an integral part in all aspects of daily life. In this program a park ranger will use real parts of the buffalo to examine the different ways Native American tribes utilized the sacred animal.
