Happy Friday! South City's voter turnout is currently at a heartbreaking 11%, while the rest of San Mateo County is at around 15% turnout (2). Election day is next TUESDAY March 5th andit's just around the corner. We need to make sure our South City community is well represented in this election, and I know we can do better! It's easy—just fill out your ballot and drop it in any of the Official Ballot Drop Boxes in town, at 400 Grand Ave (City Hall) or 901 Civic Campus Way (new Library). You can also vote in person at the Early Vote Center at our new Library now through March 5th; or either of the two 4-day vote centers from March 2nd through the 5th. Please remind your family and friends to vote too!

Roberta Cerri Teglia was inducted into the <u>County of San Mateo Women's Hall of Fame</u> in 1985 and the Roberta Cerri Teglia (Senior) Center on the corner of Grand Ave. and Magnolia Ave. was dedicated in her name in 2019. CITY COUNCIL UPDATE

City Council recently approved a resolution awarding a contract for construction of the Orange Memorial Park Aquatic Center to Wickman Development and Construction of Oakland, California. The official groundbreaking ceremony for the project will be Saturday, March 30 at Orange Memorial Park. More details regarding the groundbreaking will be coming so please be sure to stay tuned and I hope to see you there!

City Council also approved a resolution accepting a San Mateo County Transportation Authority (TA) Highway Program grant in the amount of just under \$1.5 million for the Junipero Serra Boulevard & I-280 Westborough Pedestrian & Bicycle Connectivity and Safety Project. The grant will fund the next two pre-design phases of the project which consists of the Project Initiation Document (PID) Phase to define the project's scope, cost, and schedule and to obtain conceptual approval within Caltrans; and the Environmental Studies Phase to analyze the effect and impact of the various project alternatives to conformity with state and federal environmental regulations.


Kids' Art Workshop: Celebrate Women in Art!




Seniors' Fine Art Exploration



Caltrain Electric Train Testing & Virtual Community Meeting

Starting in mid-March, Caltrain will begin testing their new electric trains between San Mateo and San Jose. In April, Caltrain will expand electric train testing to cover the entire corridor from San Francisco to San Jose. These tests mark a significant step towards modernizing and enhancing rail service for both passengers and the communities that Caltrain serves. To minimize disruption to regular service, testing will be conducted during weeknights night between 9 p.m. and 4 a.m. Residents may hear additional noise during testing hours, including grade crossing activations and train horns.

Caltrain will be holding a virtual community meeting on Tuesday, March 5 at 5:30 p.m. via Zoom to discuss the upcoming testing schedule and activities.
