




## Hey SSF,




exciting groundbreaking ceremony (party) on Saturday, March 30 beginning at 10:00 a.m.!



**How to Discard Your Waste Responsibly** 







Here are some simple steps to ensure compliance with California Senate Bill 1383 (SB 1383), an important bill aimed at reducing organic waste and fighting climate change.

- 1. Separate Your Organic Waste (food scraps, yard trimmings, and food-soiled paper products), and place them in your green bin provided by South San Francisco Scavenger.
- 2. Subscribe to Organics Collection Service through South San Francisco Scavenger by calling (650) 589-4020.
- 3. Take advantage of the free kitchen compost pailoffered by SSF Public Works to all residents (limit one per household) to easily collect food scraps in your kitchen before transferring them to your outdoor organics bin. Call SSF Public Works at (650) 877-8550 or email Web-PW@ssf.net to get your own free pail.
- **4. Reduce Food Waste** by storing food properly to prolong its freshness, and donate excess food to local food banks or charitable organizations whenever feasible.
- **5. Encourage your neighbors and friends** to also comply with SB 1383.
