CORA is providing free 15-minute trainings to small businesses and their staff — teaching them how to spot signs of relationship abuse, what to say, how to respond, and what resources to provide! And our city is funding these trainings for every business who chooses to take part in South San Francisco! TOMORROW: Orange Memorial Park Aquatic Center Groundbreaking






