The Economic Advancement Center Can Help!

The *Economic Advancement Center* (EAC), located at 366 Grand Avenue, opened earlier this year and has already helped hundreds of our residents and small businesses by offering free workforce training, career advice, small business support, and programs to help people start their own business. The EAC is operated by the City of South San Francisco and houses *Renaissance Entrepreneurship Center*, *JobTrain*, Leadership Council of San Mateo County, and the YMCA.

And something new -- starting Monday, December 5, *JobTrain* will begin offering a 17-week program of evening Medical Assistant career training. Medical Assisting is an in-demand career, offering many career pathways and unlimited upward mobility. There are currently more than 1,600 open positions for medical assistants in San Francisco and San Mateo counties. Through various lectures and hands-on experience, students will be able to implement a variety of medical assistant skills such as following HIPAA & OSHA guidelines, general administrative duties, medical terminology, clinical duties, billing, and coding. Life skills and job readiness training are also provided during this training course, and once completed, *JobTrain* offers job placement services. This training is at NO COST to participants. CalFresh



There's Even More Happening at 366 Grand Avenue!

In addition to our brand-new Economic Advancement Center, every Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., residents can stop by and get services from the San Mateo County's Outreach Unit, a "mobile office" providing easy access to social services such as food, health care insurance and more. This Outreach Unit is staffed with *CalFresh* and Medi-Cal program supervisors, coordinators, benefits analysts, and community workers. The Mobile office mirrors the same process, regulations, and rules as the regional offices.

What is CalFresh?

CalFresh is a nutrition program that can help low-income individuals and families purchase healthy foods. CalFresh provides monthly financial assistance on a debit-like card known as an EBT card. If approved, your benefits will automatically be added to your account each month. The amount of benefits you can receive is dependent on your family size, countable income, and monthly expenses such as housing & utilities. The EBT card can be used at most grocery stores, discount chains, Farmers Markets, and neighborhood stores.

Why apply?

CalFresh will stretch your food dollars. You can buy more fruit, vegetables, eggs, milk, and other nutritious foods to help you and your family stay healthy. If you are finding it difficult to afford the nutritious food that you and your family need, the *CalFresh Program* may be able to help you. You can apply for *CalFresh* online through their website (https://www.smcgov.org/hsa/calfresh-eligibility) or stop by 366 Grand Avenue on a Friday between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

Aquatic Center



New Aquatic Center at Orange Memorial Park is Taking Shape!

The City is building a new Aquatic Center at Orange Memorial Park, replacing the current city pool which has nearly reached the end of its useful life. The new Aquatic Center will be located at the corner of Orange Park at Orange Avenue and Tennis Drive, adjacent to the existing pool, allowing for the current Orange Pool to remain in operation while the new aquatic center is constructed. Once the new facility opens, the old pool will be demolished making way for a new parking lot and drop-off. Construction of the new aquatic center is expected to begin in spring/summer 2023 and the projected opening date is spring/summer 2025.



The conceptual design of the new Aquatic Center includes the following: an indoor pool with seven (25-yard) lap lanes and beach entry; an outdoor pool with 10 (25-yard x 25-meter) lap lanes; two sets of locker rooms for each pool; three individual family locker rooms; activity room; pool equipment storage, mechanical equipment rooms, drop-off and ADA parking, landscaping integrated with Orange Memorial Park, and the relocation and enhancement of the existing Veterans Memorial at the park.

Centennial Way Trail Improvements

The City of South San Francisco, with matching grant funding assistance from the State of California, will construct a new fouracre linear park along Centennial Way, between Huntington Avenue and Spruce Avenue. Amenities will include a skate space, bike park, playground, outdoor classroom, pollinator garden, and more! Public Safety in South San Francisco



Commission on Equity and Public Safety in South San Francisco

The new **South San Francisco Commission on Equity and Public Safety** has been hard at work in 2022! Last June, the South San Francisco City Council created a **Commission on Equity and Public Safety** to make recommendations regarding city policies and procedures that impact equity, safety, and security in South San Francisco. The Commission engages community participation in City programs and policies regarding equity and safety, and meetings are open to anyone in the public to attend. The Commission has decided to focus on policing in its first year. The Commission is currently reviewing the *Community Wellness and Crisis Response Team* model, which sends a Mental Health Clinician to co-respond with police to emergency calls regarding people suffering a mental crisis.

The Commission was developed from a recommendation from the prior *Commission on Racial and Social Equity*, which was appointed in 2020 following the murder of George Floyd and worked throughout 2020 and 2021 examining equity issues in South San Francisco. The current Commission carries on this legacy as an ongoing community space to make recommendations for equity and social justice. Meetings are open to the public and public comments are welcome. The Commission meets the third Monday of every month. More information can be found at www.ssf.net.

What is Cultures United?

The City of South San Francisco has kicked off its new diversity initiative, the *Cultures United Campaign*! Cultures United celebrates our City's wonderfully diverse community through cultural heritage months and holidays, acknowledging and paying tribute to the many cultures that make up our city. Adopt a Storm Drain

Winter Rains Are Around the Corner: Help Avoid Flooding by **Adopting a Storm Drain**

Underneath the streets of South San Francisco is a hidden maze of storm drains, which helps ensure our homes and businesses don't flood during heavy rains. This underground network is fed by 2,629 storm drains located on every street and neighborhood in our City. The effectiveness of this system is only as good as our ability to keep our streets clean and the storm drains open and flowing. The system doesn't work well when clogged with litter, leaves, and other debris which, unfortunately, clog the storm drains.

YOU can make a DIFFERENCE! Volunteer to help keep our storm drains free from litter and debris by "Adopting a **Storm Drain**" in our City. Simply picking up any litter or sweeping debris away from the storm drain will go a long way towards ensuring the system is ready and working when we have heavy rains. Adopt a Storm Drain near where you live, or get your neighbors together and adopt your block or even adopt a block in the commercial area to help keep our City clean. Volunteers will receive a box of supplies and advice on how best to keep storm drains clear.
