

<u>Sister Cities International 2020 Annual Conference – Reimagining Citizen Diplomacy: New Connections in a</u> <u>Virtual World announces Annual Award Winners</u>

Washington, DC – Sister Cities International (SCI) has hosted their first ever Virtual Annual Conference titled – Reimagining Citizen Diplomacy: New Connections in a Virtual World. This was the first exclusively virtual event in the history of Sister Cities International, designed to involve any and all people who are interested in Sister Cities International and its mission.

The annual conference, which took place on July 8–9, 2020, connected sister cities members, United Nations representatives, business leaders, academics, civic leaders, special performers, and others to engage communities worldwide on our online platform. Leaders and attendees discussed issues revolving around the virtual world regarding sister city connections.
