## Skate and Bike Stakeholder Meeting #1 Summary Centennial Way Trail Improvements

Date: September 12, 2022

Time: 5:30 – 7:30 PM Location: Virtual Meeting

City staff and the design team met with the skate and bike community to discuss the planned skate space and bike park along Centennial Trail. Eight members of the community attended the meeting. Below is a summary of general comments received.

## Skate Space

- 1. The skate space should be integrated into the surrounding improvements so it feels inclusive instead of being fenced-off.
- 2. The skate space should have a blend of elements for skaters of different skill levels.
- 3. Something unique is desired, so the skate space becomes a destination and notable for South San Francisco.
- 4. A signature feature could draw inspiration from the wind harp sculpture or the SSF branch library.
- 5. A simple design with a large amount of open space and a few key features would still be desirable.
- 6. A mini ramp is typically a well-used feature and could be considered as an auxiliary feature.
- 7. The skate space could take the form of an urban plaza with architectural features that doesn't necessarily look like a traditional skate park.
- 8. Consider providing elements that are skateable but not exclusive to skateboarding use (seatwalls, benches, etc.)

## **Bike Park**

- 1. Although a dirt surface is nice, an asphalt surface is more suitable in this context to ease maintenance.
- 2. A series of jumps should be considered because they offer a greater challenge compared to a pump track.
