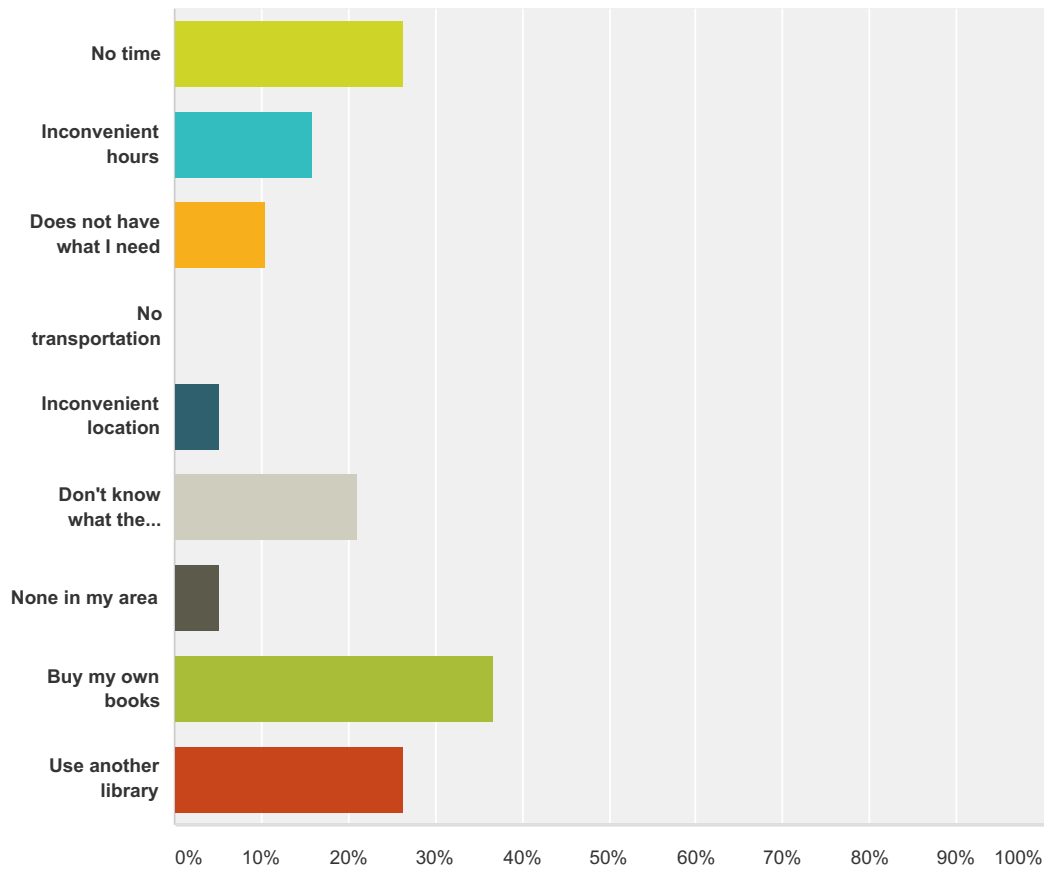

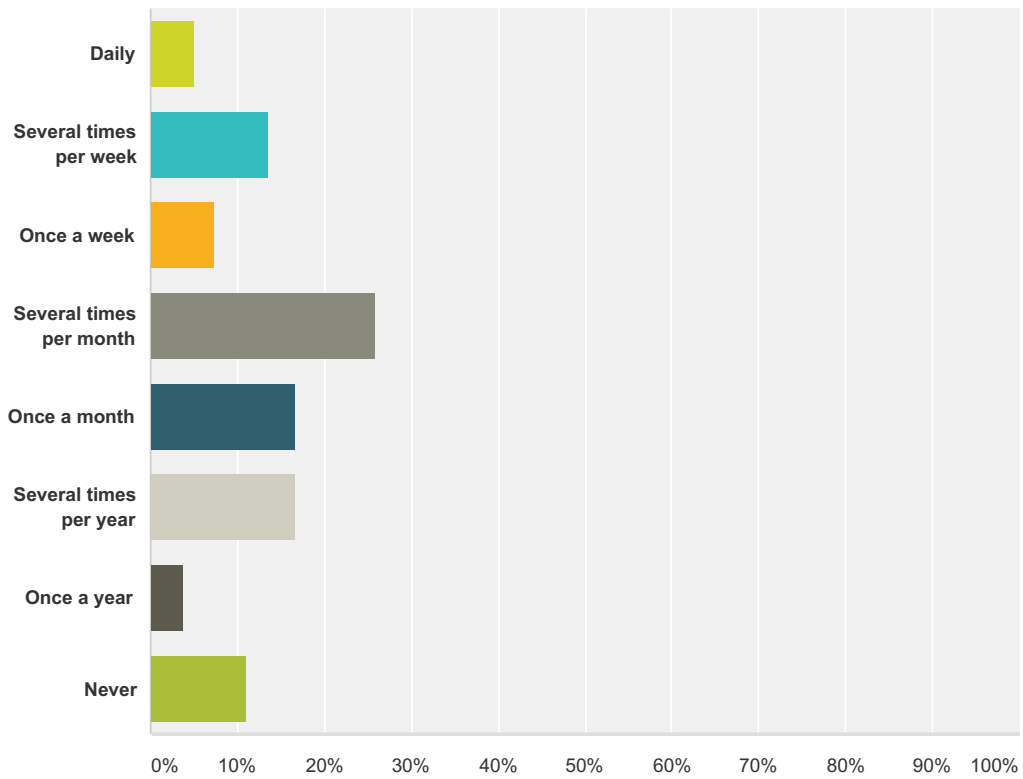

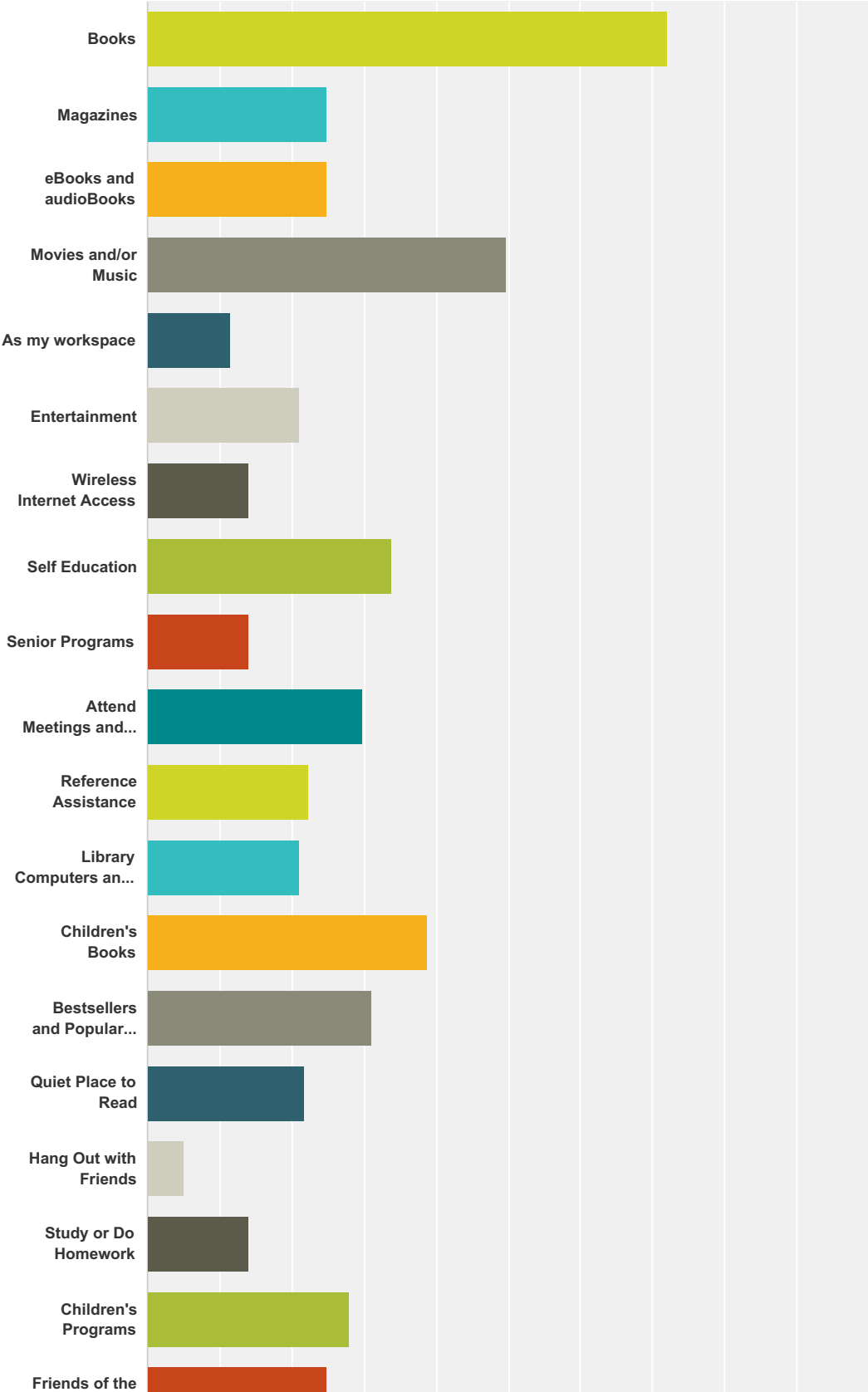

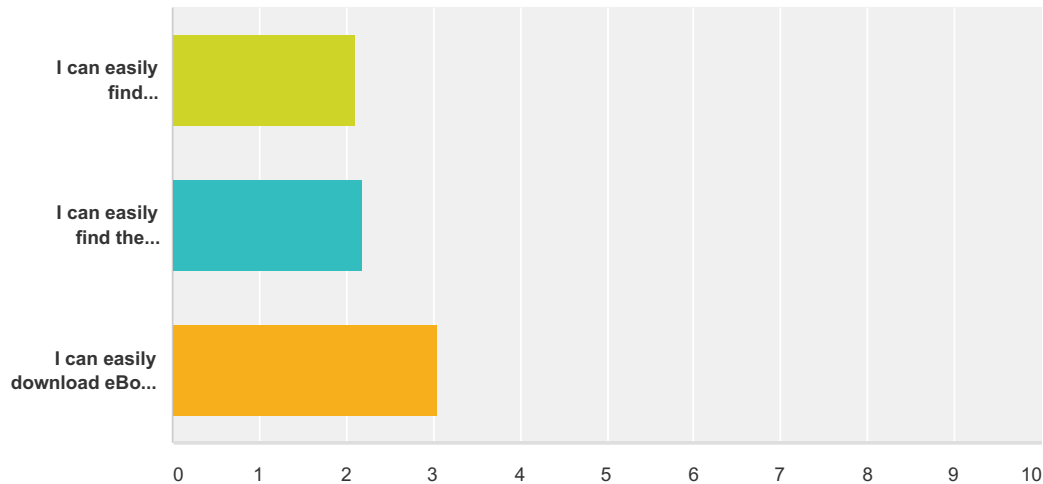

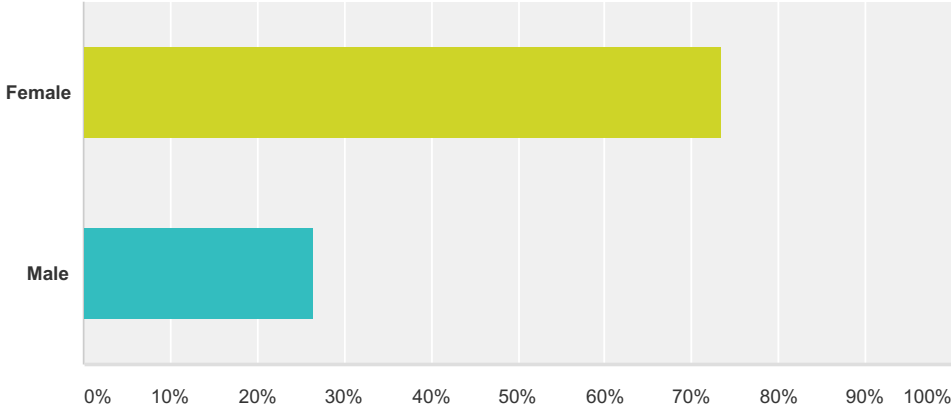

Q17 What is your gender?

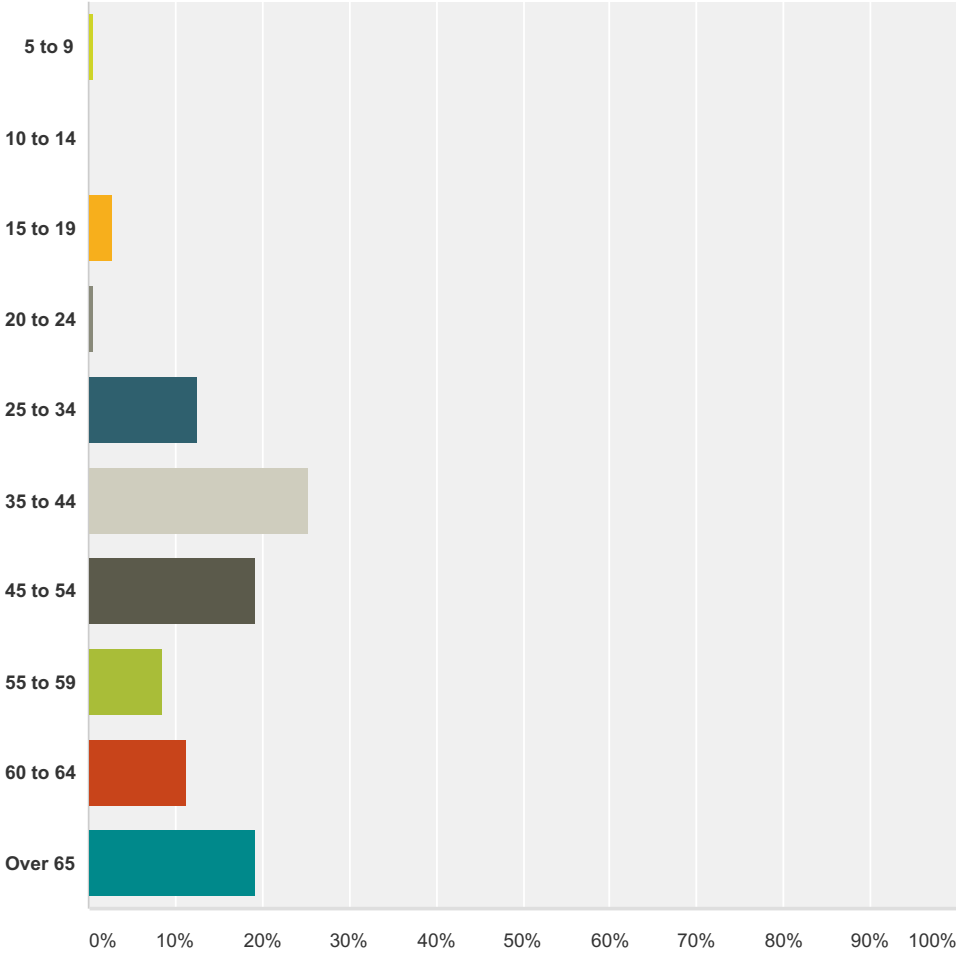

Q18 What is Your Age Group?

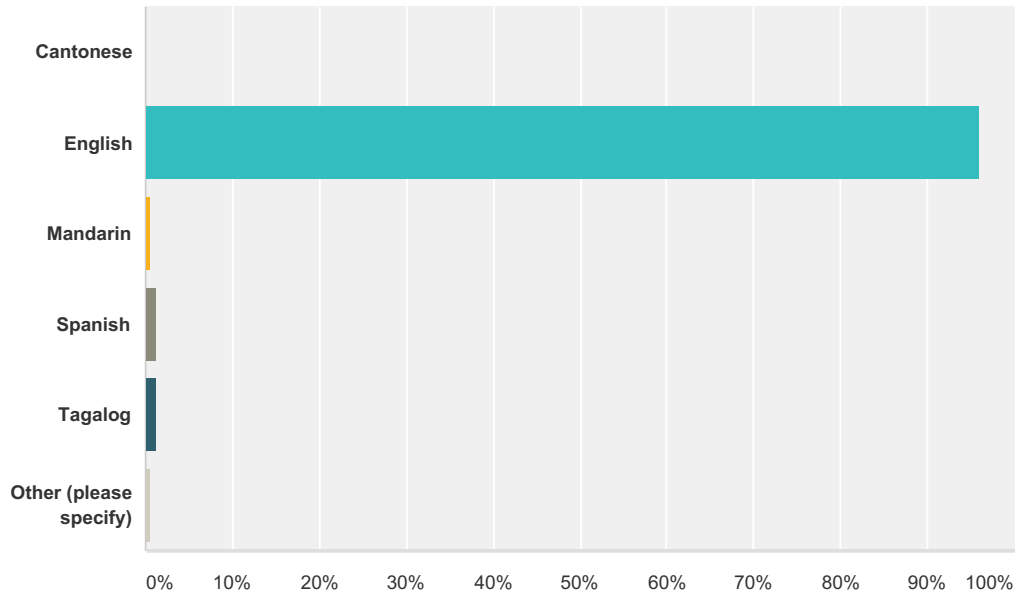

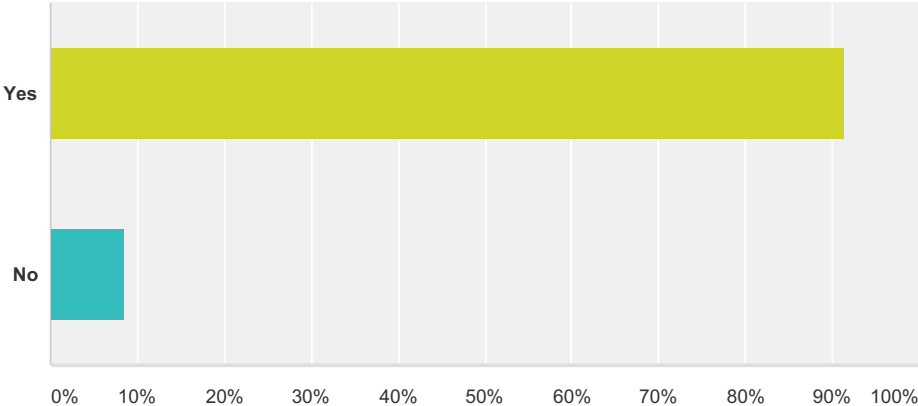

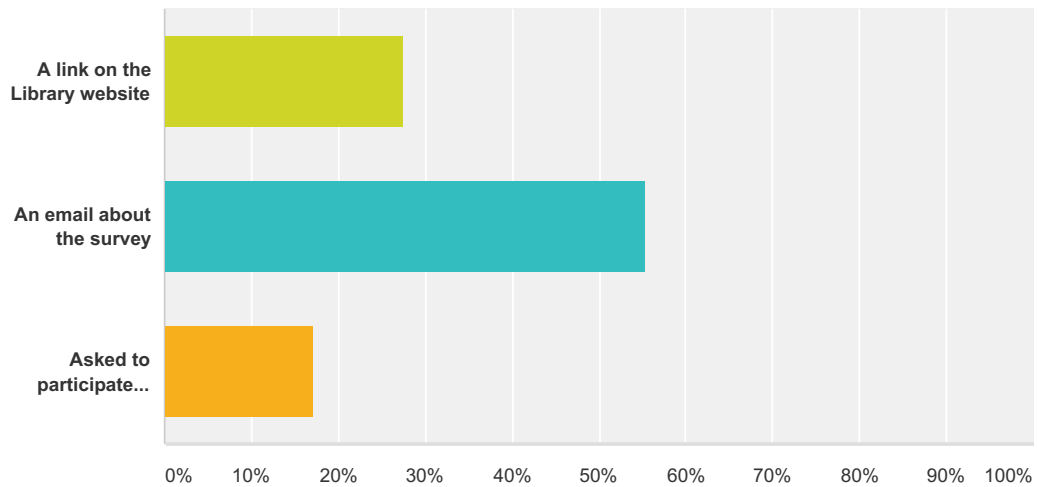

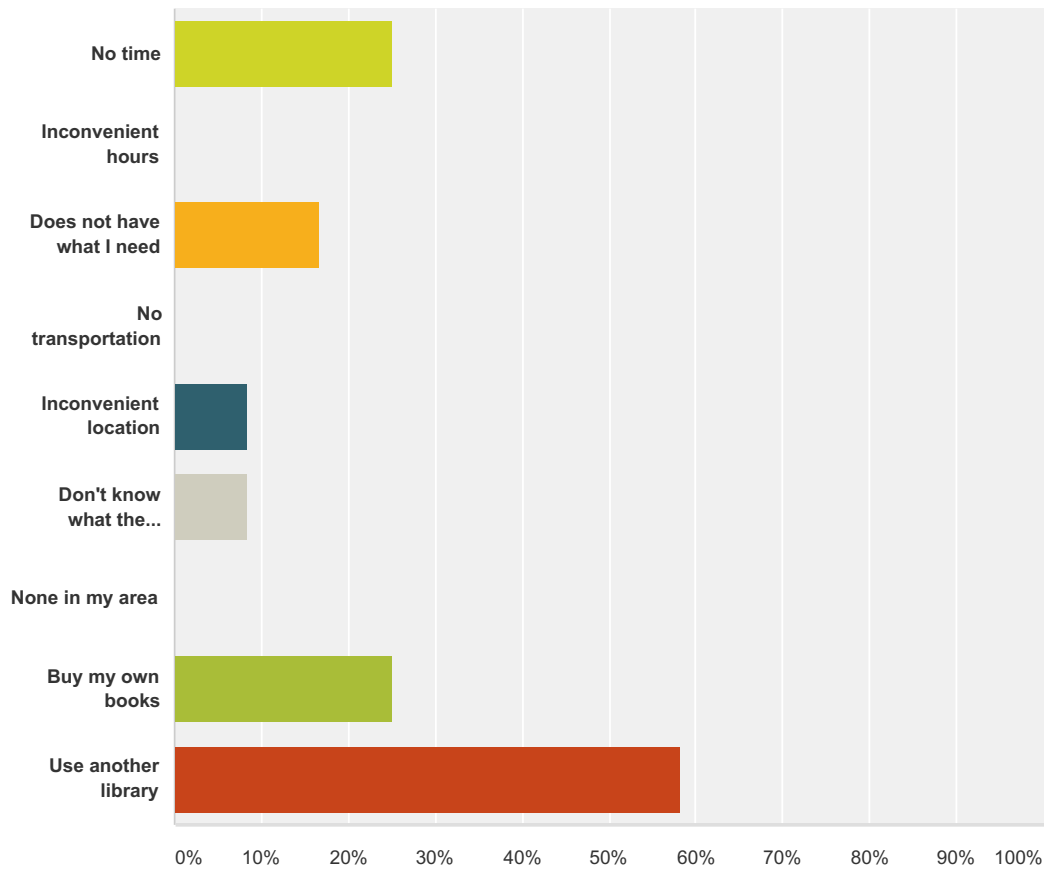

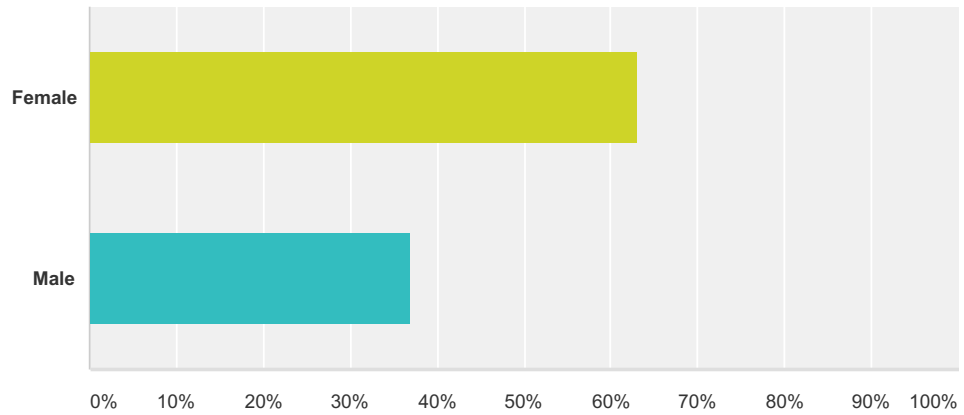

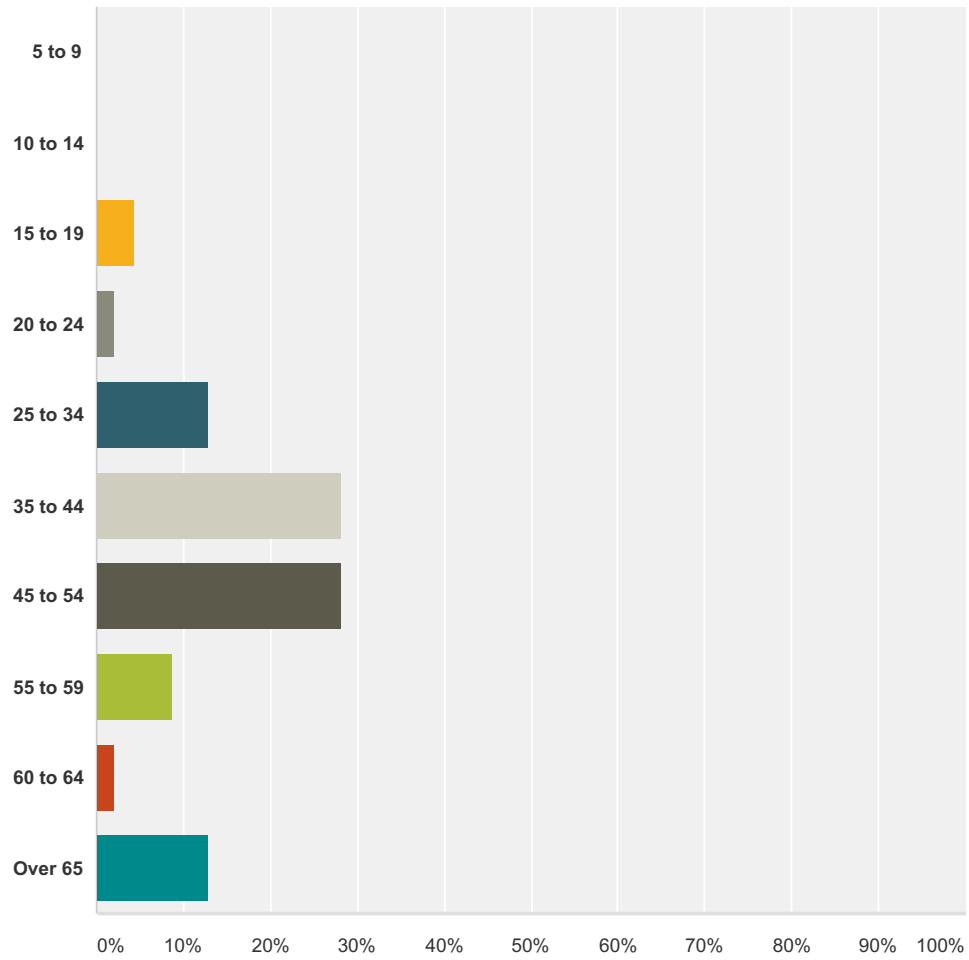

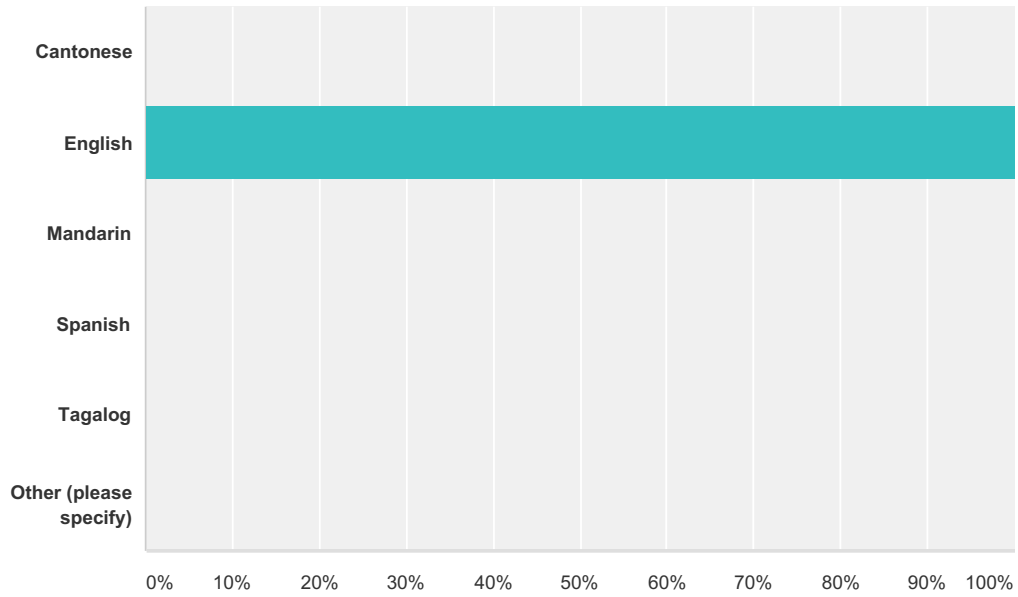

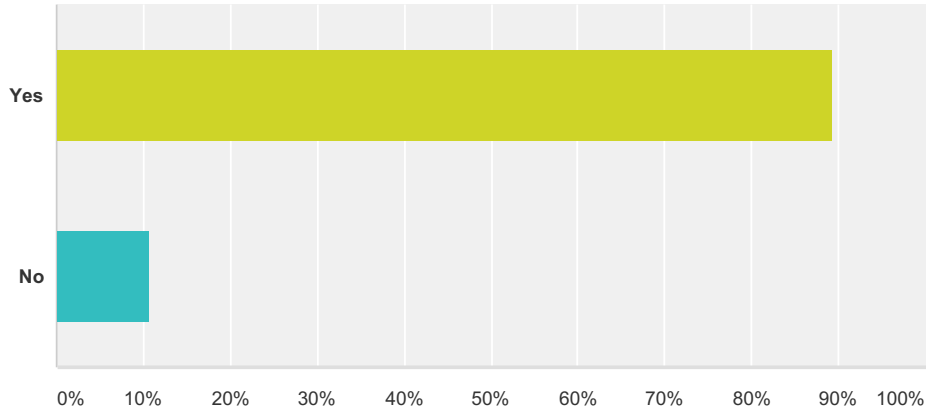
